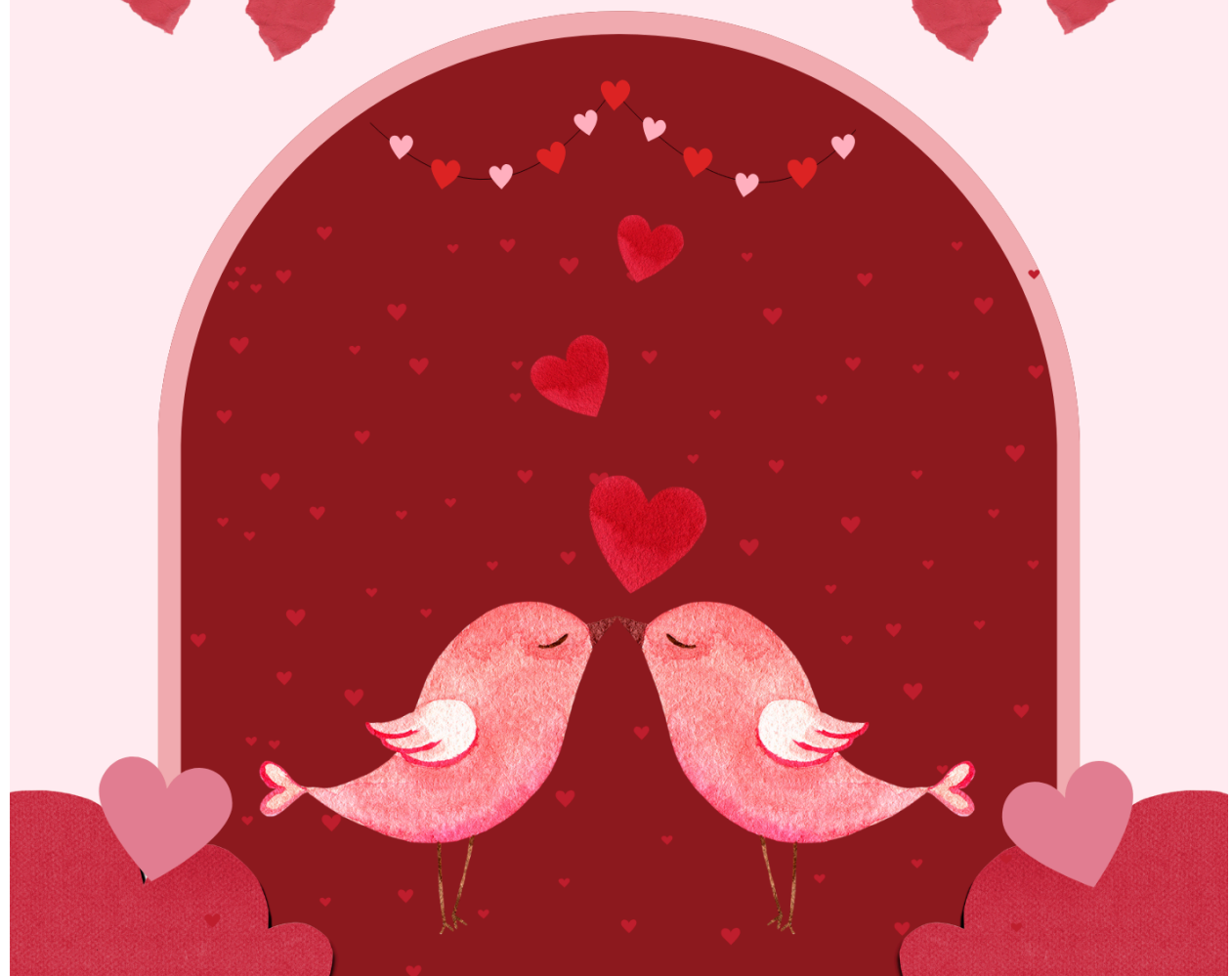


VALENTINE'S DAY ACTIVITIES



Poetry by Pablo Neruda



First read the small text about the author's life and answer the questions that follow:

Pablo Neruda was one of the most important poets of the 20th century. He was born in Chile in 1904, and his real name was Ricardo Eliecer Neftalí Reyes Basoalto. He chose the name Pablo Neruda as a pen name when he began writing poetry and later, he made it his legal name.

He started writing poems as a teenager and his work quickly became popular, especially because of his romantic poetry. One of his most famous books is *Twenty Love Poems and a Song of Despair*, published when he was only 19 years old. His poems often explore deep emotions like love, sadness, and hope, using powerful images from nature.



However, he was more than a love poet. He was also deeply involved in politics because he believed in social justice and spoke out for the rights of poor and working-class people. At one point, he was elected as a politician in Chile. Because of his political views, he had to leave the country and live in exile for some years.

In 1971, he received the Nobel Prize in Literature for his poetry and his contribution to peace and justice. He died in 1973, shortly after a military coup in Chile.

Today, people around the world still read and admire Neruda's poetry. His writing is known for its honesty, emotion, and beauty. Many of his poems have been translated into different languages, so people everywhere can enjoy his work. His poems speak to the heart and the mind, and they continue to inspire readers of all ages.
